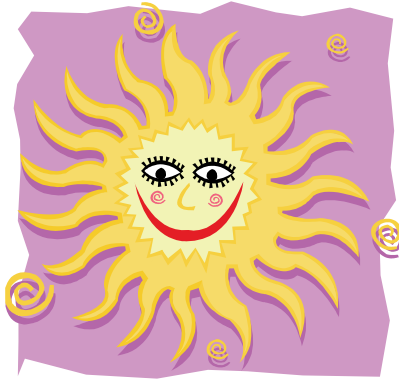

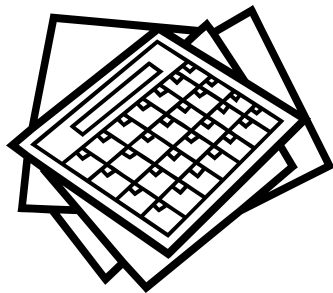

SQUARE MEALS

Recipes courtesy of Washington Square Residents



Frito Tostada

Saute 1/2 lb to 1 lb. Ground beef with chopped onion to taste. Add 1 small can of tomato sauce and 1 small can of tomato paste; plus about 2/3 to 1 cup of water. Add 1 tsp. Ground cumin (or chili powder). While it is cooking, boil water and cook 1/2 to 1 cup white rice. Add rice to meat/tomato sauce. Chop tomatoes, lettuce, black olives. 1 cup cheddar cheese. Use one bag of small Fritos. Have on hand sour cream and taco sauce. To serve: put a handful of fritos on plate. Spoon on warm meat sauce. Top with cheese and desired toppings. Top with sour cream and taco sauce. Kids and adults love it, and best of all, no cooking

In The Garden with Carolyn



Hi readers. Have you looked lately at the White iceberg rose bushes at Bristol St. In 'N Out? They are now blooming their heads off!

In this issue I am going to share free and cheap fertilizers! I spent \$9 (a nursery sale price; regular \$12) for 3 lbs. Of SuperBloom granulated food. I had to measure and mix water and it took 2-3 hours to put on All my plants that bloom. Much cheaper is Fish Emulsion You can put it on anything that grows. It smells very bad, but it can't burn plants. You can find it at OSH or K-Mart. I also made a simple "compost pile", throwing grass clippings, crushed egg shells and some coffee grounds and leftover or over ripe fruits and vegetables. Water a little maybe once a week and stir. My pile is in the shade, under a tree. I think this is best or it can "overheat". After sitting for several months I put this mixture as mulch around my hydrangea and it did wonders! For houseplants, use weak tea or add water to leftover plain coffee (no cream) until it looks like light iced tea and water your plants with it. Most houseplants like an acid soil and this will green up the leaves!

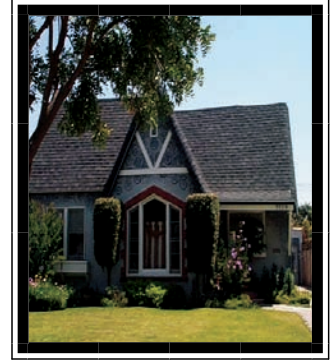

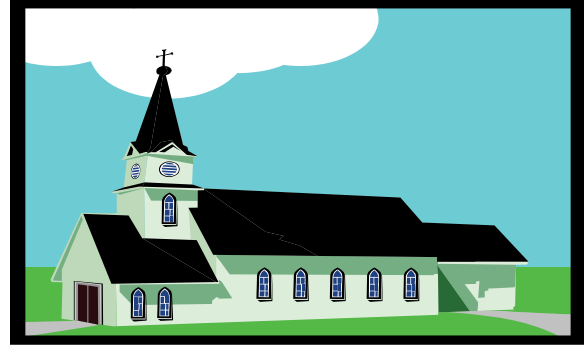
