SQUARE MEALS

Recipes courtesy of Washington Square Residents

Caprese Melts

Prep time: 15 minutes Serves: 3 sandwiches

6 slices sourdough sandwich bread. (Trader Joes has a wonderful wheat sourdough bread. Yum)

1 Tablespoon Olive oil

15 or so fresh basil leaves, rinsed

2 ripe tomatoes, sliced thick

4 ounces of fresh mozzarella cheese

Salt and pepper to taste

Brush one side of each bread slice with olive oil. Place 3 slices of bread, oil side down, on a 10 by 15 inch baking sheet and layer evenly with basil leaves, tomato slices, and mozzarella slices. Sprinkle lightly with salt and pepper and top with remaining bread slices, oil side up. Broil sandwiches six or so inches from the heat, turning once, until bread is golden brown and cheese is melted, 2 to 3 minutes total. Serve immediately. Enjoy!

Home brew Garden Tonics:

Slug and Snail Zapper

Grab a cleaned-out spray bottle and fill with 1/2 household ammo-

nia and 1/2 water. Adjust the nozzle to the stream setting. Get out early while the one-footed creatures are still out, and give them a good zap where you see them. The ammonia does two things-it disintegrates snails and slugs on contact and breaks down in your garden to a form of nitrogen. The water dilutes the ammonia so it won't burn your plants.

Sugar Booster

Give your plants an energy boost that will make them big and abundant. Sugar sprayed on leaves helps a declining plant to recover, enables fruit trees to produce bumper crops, and encourages flowering plants to bloom more. Mix 16 ounces of Karo Syrup with 16 ounces of water and 2 ounces of seaweed concentrate. Store in the refrigerator. When you are

Ready to feed plants, mix 4 Tbls. Of Booster with 1 Tbls. Of Ivory dish soap and one gallon of water. Fill your hand-held spray bottle and apply to plants as often as you wish. Cover all leaf surfaces. The longer the tonic stays on the plant, the more of it will be absorbed.

Root Tonic

Here is an example of a product you can buy at the nursery but shouldn't. Epsom salts costs four times as much on the garden shelf as it does in the sprained-ankle section of the drug store. It is not salt, but a form of magnesium sulfate. Plants love and are passionate about Epsom salts. They can't get enough. A once-a-month feed is plenty. Sprinkle it on dry, one cup per large plant and a handful for smaller perennials and annuals. Or use it wet-one cup per gallon of water. Epsom salts does two things. Promotes basal breaks (new growth and flowering buds) and soothes tired garden muscles when used in a hot bath.
